What Is the Difference Between Prejudice and Discrimination?

Prejudice is the **judgement** of someone or something without knowing enough information about that person or thing.

Discrimination is **treating** someone differently because of their race, ethnicity, ability, gender, sex, orientation, religion, physical appearance, employment status or age. We can think of prejudice as an **attitude or belief**, and discrimination as an **action or behaviour**.
